Abstract The Chester and Maud Dale Papers document Chester's art collection, the

couple's art-related activities, and their biography. Materials consist of newspaper clippings, scrapbooks, correspondence, notebooks, ephemera,

and photographs.

Biographical Note

1883 Chester Dale is born in New York City, 3 May 3, 1883.

1876 Maud Murray is born in Rochester, New York, June 25, 1876.

1893 Maud is enrolled at the Art Students League of New York.

1898 Maud marries Frederick M. Thompson, a Yale graduate and fellow art

student.

1900 Chester becomes a runner for F. J. Lisman & Company, a Wall Street firm

specializing in railroad securities.

1903 Chester becomes a securities trader on his own.

1909	Chester becomes founding partner of William C. Langley & Company.
1911	Maud and Frederick divorce. Eight months later, Chester and Maud marry. Chester and Maud reside at 132 East 19 th Street in Manhattan, known as the "Block Beautiful."
1918	Chester and Maud move to 54 West 9 th Street. Chester becomes a member of the New York Stock Exchange.
1924	Chester and Maud move to 103 East 75 th Street.
1925	Chester and Maud move to the Park Lane Hotel, 299 Park Avenue at 48 th Street.
	Maud's exhibition <i>Douze Décors de Théâtre</i> is on view at Galerie J. Allard in Paris during October.
1926	Maud counsels Chester to focus his collecting on French art of the past 150 years.
	With Maud's guidance, Chester begins to buy in earnest, acquiring thirty works at twenty-two different galleries and sales in Paris during May and June.
1927	Chester and Maud move to the Hotel Beverly, 125 East 50 th Street.
1928	Maud organizes the first show devoted entirely to works in the Chester Dale Collection, Loan Exhibition of Modern French Art from the Chester Dale Collection at Wildenstein Galleries in October.
	Chester buys a share of the Galerie Georges Petit in Paris.
1929	A catalogue of the Chester Dale Collection titled <i>Before Manet to Modigliani in the Chester Dale Collection</i> by Maud is published by Alfred A. Knopf.
	Chester is elected to the Board of Trustees of the newly created Museum of Modern Art, New York. He resigns in 1931.
1930	Chester funds the renovations for the new Museum of French Art on the third floor of the French Institute in the United States at 20-22 East 60 th Street and Maud is appointed head of the museum's Exhibitions Committee.

1931 The Museum of French Art opens in January.

Four exhibitions organized by Maud are shown at the Museum of French Art during the year: *Portraits of Women Loan Exhibition: Romanticism to Surrealism* opens on January 20, *Picasso-Braque-Léger* opens February 22, *Degas and His Tradition* opens on March 17, and *Renoir and His Tradition* opens November 24.

Chester and Maud move to a penthouse apartment in the Carlyle Hotel, 35 East 76th Street.

Maud receives the Cross of the Legion of Honor from the French Government.

Maud organizes her final two exhibitions at the Museum of French Art: Fantin-Latour, which opens on January 12, and Derain-Vlaminck
Comparative Exhibition, which opens on February 23.

Maud resigns as chairman of the Exhibitions Committee at the Museum of French Art.

Maud organizes the exhibition *Boldini 1845-1931* on view at Wildenstein & Co. in New York City in the spring. She also helps organize a major retrospective of Modigliani's work at the Palais des Beaux-Arts in Brussels in the fall.

Chester purchases and renovates the five-story townhouse at 20 East 79th Street. Maud installs the their art collection and Chester lives there until 1942 while Maud remains at the Carlyle Hotel.

Chester retires from William C. Langley & Company.

Chester loans seven American paintings for the opening of the National Gallery of Art on March 17. In November, twenty-five additional 19th century French paintings from the Chester Dale Collection are on display.

In February, Chester loans an additional group of 16th–18th century European paintings and numerous 19th century French works to the National Gallery. He supports war-time summer concerts at the museum.

Chester closes the house at 20 East 79th Street and moves to the Plaza Hotel, where he installs some fifty paintings and sculptures. Maud remains at the Carlyle Hotel.

	Chester is elected to the honorary position of Associate Vice President of the National Gallery of Art.
1943	Chester donates several American portraits and notable 16 th –18 th century European paintings, including <i>Saint Jerome</i> by El Greco and <i>The Bath of Venus</i> by François Boucher to the National Gallery. These are his first gifts to the museum.
	Chester is elected a trustee of the National Gallery of Art.
	In the spring, Chester sends fifty-two 20 th century French paintings on indefinite loan to the Art Institute of Chicago. Later in the year he loans some forty works to the Philadelphia Museum of Art. He becomes a trustee of both institutions.
1944	More than forty works from the Chester Dale Collection are anonymously sold at auction at Parke-Bernet Galleries on March 15.
	Chester donates Both Members of This Club, Portrait of Mrs. Dale, and Portrait of Mr. Dale by George Bellows to the National Gallery of Art. Both Members of This Club and Portrait of Mrs. Dale are placed on view in January 1945, exactly twenty years following the artist's death.
1946	Chester anonymously sells more than fifty American and modern paintings at three auctions at Parke-Bernet Galleries in February and May.
	He anonymously sells nearly seventy 19 th century French paintings at an auction at Plaza Art Galleries in October.
1951	In the fall, Chester recalls paintings from long-term loan at the Philadelphia Museum of Art and transfers them to the National Gallery of Art.
1952	In the spring Chester recalls his 20^{th} century paintings from the Art Institute of Chicago and sends most to the National Gallery of Art.
	He resigns from the Board of Trustees of the Art Institute of Chicago and is named a trustee of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.
1953	Maud dies in August in a nursing home in Southampton, New York.
1954	Chester marries Mary Towar Bullard in May. She had served as Maud's art secretary since 1928.

	Chester suffers a major heart attack in November.
1955	On October 18, Chester is elected President of the National Gallery of Art.
1956	Chester resigns as a trustee of the Philadelphia Museum of Art.
1962	Chester dies December 16, bequeathing the bulk of his collection to the National Gallery of Art.
1965	National Gallery of Art holds an exhibition of the Chester Dale bequest from May to August.

Scope and Content

The Chester and Maud Dale Papers document the art activities of Chester and Maud Dale and the formulation of the Chester Dale Collection. Maud encouraged and developed Chester's interest in art and collecting. Of interest are the Artist and Dealer Files which include correspondence, invoices, bills of sale, inventories, shipping records, and other documentation; and collection notebooks which record information about the purchase, provenance, reproduction, and exhibition history of the works of art in the Dale collection.

A large portion of the papers consists of newspaper clippings, some of which are organized into scrapbooks. The clippings and scrapbooks document the couple's social lives, Chester Dale's business activities, Maud Dale's involvement with the Museum of French Art, the Dale Collection, the National Gallery of Art, and general information about the art world such as exhibitions and sales.

Of note are files relating specifically to Maud Dale's art-related writings and activities, including her time as chairman of the Exhibitions Committee of the Museum of French Art from 1931-1932. Also included are files related to Chester Dale's estate and two guest books documenting visitors and notable individuals to the Dale residences. The papers also include photographs of the works of art in the Collection and their installation at the Plaza Hotel and in other venues, and images of the Dales and their residence.

Series Descriptions

Series 1 Artist and Dealer Files, 1912–1963 [3 boxes]

The Artist and Dealer Files include correspondence, invoices, bills of sale, inventories, shipping

records, and other documentation related to the Dales' art collecting. There are several folders of correspondence with art dealers Étienne Bignou and Paul Rosenberg.

Series 2 Chester Dale Collection Notebooks, undated [1 box]

There are two collection notebooks in this series. One is noted as being started by Maud Dale and continued by Mary Dale. The creator of the second one is unknown. They both include purchase, provenance, reproduction, and exhibition information about works of art in the Chester Dale Collection.

Series 3 Administrative Files, 1919–1975 [2 boxes]

The Administrative Files contain legal and financial records, with several folders related to Chester Dale's estate, and some general correspondence. The two guest books in this series contain signatures of collectors, art historians, museum administrators, artists, and visitors of the Dales. The smaller in size of the two guest books includes signatures by Étienne Bignou, René Gimpel, Jean Lurçat, José Clemente Orozco, Arshile Gorky, and Martha Graham. The second volume includes signatures by Ambroise Vollard, Alice Halicka, Othon Friesz, Katherine Dreier, Pierre Roy, Marie Harriman, and Salvador Dalí. Dalí added a pen drawing to his signature.

Series 4 Newspaper Clippings and Printed Ephemera, 1921–1962 [3 boxes]

This series includes loose newspaper clippings, magazine articles, and various ephemera relating to the personal, social, and professional lives of Maud and Chester beginning in 1921. The clippings include coverage of the Chester Dale Collection and the National Gallery of Art as well as general art topics such as auctions and exhibitions.

Series 5 Scrapbooks, 1877–1961 [9 boxes]

This series consists of scrapbooks primarily devoted to Maud and Chester Dale, the Chester Dale Collection, the National Gallery of Art, and other general art matters. The scrapbooks mostly contain newspaper clippings with a few other noteworthy items, including an autographed photograph of George Bellows, a photograph of Henri Matisse at the exhibition of his works at the Galerie Georges Petit in June 1931, and photographs of the exhibition opening dinner. One scrapbook was compiled for Maud Dale in 1933. Of particular note is also a family scrapbook that belonged to Chester's father, Thomas Dale that includes information about the Dale family from around 1877 to the early twentieth century. Series 6 Maud Dale Files, 1928–1939 [3 boxes]

The Maud Dale Files series contains writings, press clippings, exhibition catalogues, correspondence, and other documents reflecting Maud Dale's activities at the Museum of French Art in New York and her other art-related interests. Maud wrote short prefaces to about twenty art books and brochures as well as about a dozen articles in newspapers and periodicals between 1928 and 1933 on the topics of modern French art, romanticism, impressionism, George Sand, Josef Stránský, and Amedeo Modigliani, of whom she helped to organize a retrospective exhibition at the Palais des Beaux-Arts in Brussels in 1933. During her time as chairman of the Exhibitions Committee of the Museum of French Art from 1931-1932, she organized the following exhibitions: *Portraits of Women Loan Exhibition: Romanticism to Surrealism; Picasso-Braque-Léger*,

Degas and His Tradition; Renoir and His Tradition; Fantin-Latour and Derain-Vlaminck Comparative Exhibition.

Maud had studied art in Paris with Theophile A. Steinlen, a disciple of Honoré Daumier. She also made stage designs, which were shown in the exhibition *Douze Décors de Théâtre* in Paris in 1925 and in New York in 1926. A poster for the exhibition can be found in this series.

A small group of theater prints and illustrations collected by Maud Dale is also included. Most of the prints are devoted to opera singer María García Malibran (1808–1836) as well as portraits of English and American tragedians from the first part of the nineteenth century and illustrations of American theaters from that period.

Series 7 Photographs, 1934–1962 [7 boxes]

The photographs in this series depict the Dales and their friends, the Chester Dale Collection as installed in Chester's apartment at the Plaza Hotel from around1956, and views of the Southhampton, New York residence. There are also many photographs of works of art owned by Chester Dale including some sold at auction in 1944 and 1946 or otherwise disposed of, as well as many that remained in the Chester Dale Collection throughout his lifetime. Among the works of art images are installation views. For conservation purposes, negatives and color transparencies are stored separately. Select photographs in this series have been digitized and are available to researchers.
