Scope and Content

This collection documents the activities of Walter Ings Farmer as a Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) officer in Germany during and immediately after World War II. After leaving the military in 1946, Farmer returned to the United States and continued his career as an art historian and interior designer.

The papers in this collection consist of official documents and personal materials relating to Farmer's work as a MFAA officer. Wartime materials include subject files, monthly reports and inventory lists, correspondence spanning the immediate postwar years though most of Farmer's life, museum entry passes, wartime art exhibition catalogues, newspaper clippings and publications, including six issues of the short-lived journal *The Spoils of War*. Of special interest

are approximately 1,330 photographs, loose and in two photograph albums, documenting works of art held and redistributed from the Central Collecting Point in Wiesbaden, Germany. In his later years, Farmer became interested in the study of confiscated art and its ramifications in the museum and art world. Included are materials he compiled while conducting research for his posthumously published book, *The Safekeepers: A Memoir of the Arts at the End of World War II*. His subject files, audio recordings, and videotapes relating to art restitution are also included.

Series Descriptions

Series 1 Wartime Subject Files, 1945-1949 [box 1]

Arranged alphabetically by subject. These subject files concern Farmer's activities as an MFAA officer during World War II, including those at the Wiesbaden Central Collecting Point. Included are materials Farmer accumulated during the immediate postwar period relating to the controversy associated with sending 202 paintings from Berlin Museums to the National Gallery of Art for safekeeping in 1945. This series also contains materials relating to exhibitions of art held in Germany, including some at collecting points in the immediate postwar years, press coverage, notes and correspondence. Official monthly reports from 1945 to 1947 provide information on activities at the Wiesbaden Central Collecting Point. Inventory lists of works of art, as well as Farmer's letters to his first wife, Josselyn, written during his time at Wiesbaden, are also of note.

Series 2 Correspondence with Individuals, 1946-1996 [boxes 2-3]

Arranged alphabetically by correspondent's last name. This series consists of Farmer's correspondence with various individuals concerning the work of MFAA officers, art looting and related issues. The correspondence began during the immediate post-war years and extended through the rest of his life.

Series 3 Art Exhibition Catalogues, 1935-1951 [box 4]

Arranged alphabetically by title. This series contains catalogues of war-time art exhibitions in Germany and the United States.

Series 4 Other Publications, 1932-2000 [boxes 4-7]

Arranged alphabetically by title. Included are military and German museum publications, exhibition catalogues, articles and newspaper clippings associated with Farmer's military service in Germany. These files include printed materials assembled by Farmer as he conducted research for his book *The Safekeepers: A Memoir of the Arts at the End of World War II*. Of interest are the five issues of the short-lived journal *The Spoils of War*.

Series 5 Research Subject Files, 1945-1998 [boxes 7-9]

Arranged alphabetically by subject. This series consists of files assembled by Farmer on various subjects relating to Nazi art-looting and related controversies. The series also contains information about Farmer's military service and personal activities, including his awards and medals.

Series 6 Photographs, 1946-1996 [boxes 10-16]

Arranged alphabetically by subject. Photographs of Walter Farmer and the Wiesbaden Central Collecting Point and numbered photographs of works of art held there. Of interest are two photographic scrapbooks documenting the activities of the MFAA staff at Wiesbaden. Select photographs in this series have been digitized and are available to researchers.

Series 7 Audio Interviews, 1993-1994 [box 17]

Chronologically arranged interviews with Walter Farmer listed first, followed by chronologically arranged interviews with other individuals. These materials consist of audio cassette interviews conducted by Ruth K. Meyer, who prepared the first draft of Farmer's memoir *The Safekeepers* in 1994. Meyer conducted interviews with Walter Farmer on several dates. She also recorded brief interviews with others, including Seymour J. Pomeranze and Edith Standen.

Arranged alphabetically by title. Included are seven videotapes about looted art.
