

In 2018, Sybarite5 will premiere a new version of their most popular touring program, *Everything in Its Right Place*, with full orchestra. Recently the quintet gave the world premiere of *BEATBOX*—the first concerto for string quintet and orchestra, written by acclaimed American composer Dan Visconti.

Sybarite5 is deeply committed to education and outreach as well as performance. In addition to presenting master classes and workshops for over 60,000 students ranging in age from five to twenty-five, the group has brought its popular program, *So You Think You Can Compose*, to colleges and universities, including Luther College, Penn State, Samford University, and New College. The program gives students firsthand experience writing for string quartet.

The Ensemble

“Their rock star status...is well deserved. Their classically honed technique mixed with grit and all out passionate attack transfixes the audience...” That is how the *Sarasota Herald-Tribune* described Sybarite5, the first group of its kind to win the Concert Artists Guild International Competition. Sybarite5 has riveted audiences throughout the United States, forever changing the perception of chamber music performance. From the moment their bows hit the strings, this quintet of talented, diverse musicians takes the audience on an exciting ride that engages the senses and redefines the rules.

Dubbed the “Millennial Kronos,” Sybarite5 offers a commanding performance style and eclectic repertoire from Bowie to Radiohead and Akiho to Assad. The quintet’s debut album, *Disturb the Silence*, quickly reached the top ten on the *Billboard* charts. The group’s follow-up album, *Everything in Its Right Place*, was released at Carnegie Hall to critical acclaim. Sybarite5 recently completed its latest album, *Outliers*, featuring all new works from American composers, soon to be available.

With their dynamic view on twenty-first-century entrepreneurial musicianship, the group has conducted their Evolution of an Entrepreneur residencies and workshops at major institutions and conservatories, including the Curtis Institute of Music and the New England Conservatory. Sybarite5 was the featured ensemble in the 2016 American Composers Forum National Competition at (Le) Poisson Rouge, and the group maintains a residency at “the cell” in New York City, a nonprofit collective for artists to incubate and present their work. At the cell, Sybarite5 is experimenting with new sounds and programming with technology, such as Jakub Ciupinski’s works for Sybarite5 + Hacked Theremins, as well as pursuing global collaborations resulting from their work at the Silkroad Global Musician Workshop.

Highlights of recent seasons have included coast-to-coast performances in forty-three states, from the Library of Congress and St. Paul’s Schubert Club to the Anchorage Concert Association and the Sun Valley Center for the Arts, as well as concerts in their home of New York City at Carnegie Hall, the Lincoln Center, National Sawdust, the Apple Store, and the 92nd Street Y. In addition to their own groundbreaking, portable music festival—Forward Festival—Sybarite5 has appeared at Ravinia, Caramoor Center for Music and the Arts, Wolf Trap Opera, Interlochen Center for the Arts, Music in the Mountains, and numerous leading festivals. International appearances have included Canada’s Tuckamore Music Festival, Argentina’s New Docta International Music Festival, and Japan’s Osaka Festa.
