The National Gallery of Art renewed its mission this fiscal year with a steady focus on enriching lives by welcoming all people to explore and experience art, creativity, and our shared humanity. This call to action expresses our vision to be of the nation and for all the

people, a promise rooted in the founding of this museum as a gift to the nation. With this vision and reinvigorated mission, we introduced a bright and energetic brand identity for the National Gallery that is more than simply a refreshed logo or color palette. It is a visual manifestation of our joyful service to the nation and our commitment to a vibrant future.

With each successive generation, the nation's art collection has grown and evolved thanks to the generosity of private citizens and through the strength of the museum's longstanding public-private partnership. As we steward this institution in its eighth decade, our firm belief that the cultural inheritance of the nation belongs to everyone connects us back to the founding benefactors and forward to the future caretakers of this great institution. This insight informs the decisions that the trustees and staff make every day.

Sustaining this singular institution is a unique agreement between the federal government and the private sector, with Congress funding the operations and maintenance essential to the health of the museum and private citizens providing support for a panoply of vital activities. Thanks to these dedicated members and donors, the National Gallery will continue to serve the nation by collecting and presenting art that diversifies the stories we tell and the ways in which we tell them, preserving works of art for successive generations, producing world-class scholarship, and providing meaningful experiences that spark curiosity and deepen connections with audiences both onsite and online. The trustees and staff join me in expressing our deep gratitude to the President and the Congress of the United States for their resolute commitment to the National Gallery of Art, and to our loyal donors nationwide who sustain our mission of service. I am grateful for the steadfast support and sage counsel of my fellow trustees, who approach their work with empathy, integrity, and joy. The trustees join me in thanking the members of the Trustees' Council for their leadership and support, as well as our patrons at every level, whose support and commitment is critical.

Less than two months into this fiscal year, the museum closed to the public in response to a resurgence of COVID-19 cases. Three months later, in February 2021, the Sculpture Garden reopened in accordance with visitor capacity limits and safety protocols, followed by parts of the West and East Buildings. I commend Director Kaywin Feldman and the staff for using what they learned during the previous pandemic closures to respond quickly, shifting to a maximum telework posture and expanding the National Gallery's digital offerings. The story of online audiences told by the numbers is promising. Website traffic increased more than 36 percent since fiscal year 2019, exceeding 7.6 million visits in fiscal year 2021. During the same period, social media engagement continued to trend upward, increasing by nearly 13 percent. There is potential to be tapped in seeking to extend the institution's reach to audiences across the nation, providing meaningful and memorable digital experiences. The trustees and I, along with Kaywin and the staff, are committed to reflecting and serving the nation in all its diversity and extending the National Gallery's educational resources to wider audiences, while continuing to operate a sustainable and equitable institution.

# Director's Statement

Like the nation we serve, the National Gallery of Art has endured two tumultuous and challenging years marked by a global pandemic. We confronted temporary closures of our galleries, the postponement of long-awaited exhibitions, and a curtailment of our

onsite programs, tours, and lectures.

But this report tells a story of a museum that persevered and innovated. Through many challenges, the Gallery's powerful mission and vision for the future, matched with a talented and dedicated staff and generous and patriotic supporters, helped us continue our vital service to the nation. To further serve and reflect the nation, we have continued to actively collect works of art that meet the highest standard of excellence. Among the many outstanding works acquired this year are the National Gallery's first painting by Faith Ringgold, its first work by Edward Mitchell Bannister, and its first sculpture by Christopher Wool.

Extending the reach of our collections and exhibitions, the Gallery presented new digital content including two-minute video tours, a redesigned YouTube channel, and the podcast *Sound Thoughts on Art*. We reimagined our popular educational lesson plans to serve teachers working with remote classrooms and included art activities to support students' emotional wellness. Our scholarly lectures engaged large audiences in a virtual format. A particular highlight was the John Wilmerding Symposium on American Art and Community Celebration held in honor of Alma Thomas. Former First Lady Michelle Obama introduced the multi-day, multi-channel event that highlighted the lifelong creative practice of the pioneering DC artist.

Our engaging exhibitions, adjusted by scheduling challenges, carried on with stunning presentations of *Degas at the Opéra*; T*rue to Nature: Open-Air Painting in Europe, 1780 – 1870*; *Raphael and His Circle*; and *Lynda Benglis*. We also enlivened spaces in unexpected ways with three temporary East Building installations by contemporary artists Kay Rosen, Sarah Cain, and Avish Khebrehzadeh.

With immense gratitude to our public partners in Congress and the administration, we continued progress on the Master Facilities Plan, focused now on the renovation of our magnificent East Building. Through many significant gifts from private citizens, we strengthened, deepened, and expanded our collection, working toward our goal of making it as excellent and richly diverse as the country we represent.

We added several new National Gallery leaders, including Deputy Director Eric Motley; Carmen Ramos, the chief curatorial and conservation officer; and the museum's first-ever chief diversity, inclusion, and belonging officer and EEO director, Mikka Gee Conway. These new leaders alongside all our staff will shape the Gallery's future and support the strategic priorities that will focus our activities through 2023.

Together we strive to reflect and attract the nation, to become the nation's primary resource for art and creativity, to provide an audience-focused experience, and to operate a sustainable and equitable museum. Emerging from years of turbulence, these priorities are a steady framework for achieving the National Gallery's bold vision of being a museum that is of the nation and for all the people. I am proud of the resilience of our museum and grateful for the generosity of our country.

Eight decades after the National Gallery's founding, this gift to the nation continues to give as we live, dwell, and grow with it. In a real and tangible way, every visitor to the National Gallery helps shape how the gift grows, by interacting with our art, programs, and scholarship, and taking that inspiration back into the world. This spark was the gift of Andrew Mellon and the Founding Benefactors, and it is the gift that we, as stewards of the National Gallery, pass along to the American people.

# Year in Highlights

2021 Annual Report

In response to the pandemic and in an effort to promote the health and safety of staff, visitors, and volunteers, the National Gallery closed to the public on November 20, 2020. During the temporary closure, on-site public programming and events, films, concerts, and talks were canceled or postponed. Staff transitioned to a maximum telework posture, and we vastly increased our digital presence to serve the public. Website traffic increased more than 36 percent since fiscal year 2019. The Sculpture Garden reopened with visitor capacity limits in place on February 14, 2021, followed by portions of the West Building and East Building in accordance with social distancing and safety protocols. Remarkably, the National Gallery was still able to welcome 1,042,900 visitors in fiscal year 2021.

# A Reimagined Brand and a Reinvigorated Mission


## Digital Resources to Support Educators

Virtual classrooms became a normal part of the everyday lives of many teachers, students, and parents during the pandemic. World-class teaching resources were available on the National Gallery's website prior to the pandemic, but in

2020 and 2021 access to these resources became even more crucial for educators and families navigating temporary school closures. During fiscal year 2021, more than half a million unique users accessed education resources and downloaded lesson plans from the National Gallery's website. Incorporating works of art into the classroom — whether virtual or in-person — can spark engagement, support critical thinking, and foster social-emotional wellness in both students and educators. The National Gallery's resources support a vast community of educators and are available free of charge, 365 days a year.

## **Faith Ringgold**

The National Gallery of Art acquired *The American People Series #18: The Flag is Bleeding* (1967), its first painting by Faith Ringgold (b. 1930). This pivotal work by a leading figure of contemporary art exemplifies the artist's skill in using art as a vehicle to question the social dynamics of race, gender, and power. As a visual storyteller, Ringgold is known for her thought-provoking depictions of the difficult realities of the American experience. The painting was acquired with funds gifted by Glenstone Foundation and from the Patrons' Permanent Fund. For Ringgold, the American flag is a potent and powerful symbol. She has said, "The flag is the only truly subversive and revolutionary abstraction one can paint." This painting is part of her first fully developed body of work, *The American People Series* (1963–1967). Considered to be among her most powerful series, it features unflinching and often puzzling depictions of the racial tensions and political divisions in the United States during the 1960s.

### Artist Projects: Sarah Cain, Avish Khebrehzadeh, Kay Rosen

Sarah Cain, Avish Khebrehzadeh, and Kay Rosen were commissioned to create special siteresponsive installations for the East Building while it underwent a skylight replacement and

other renovations. The three artists — all known for making works in temporary sites or architectural spaces — took advantage of construction walls and transformed otherwise empty areas into stimulating environments. Their imaginative and problem-solving talents provided innovative solutions that enlivened the building while works of art from the permanent collection were removed or covered. Through their involvement in *Artist Projects*, Cain, Khebrehzadeh, and Rosen introduced new ways to experience familiar spaces of the East Building.

## **Jan Brueghel the Elder**

The National Gallery of Art acquired *Wooded Landscape with Travelers* (1610), an exquisite example of one of Jan Brueghel the Elder's (1568–1625) most popular landscape themes: a well-traveled road winding through woodland. This painting simultaneously reflects the traditional compositional structure developed by 16th-century Netherlandish artists and, through its increased naturalism and celebration of the everyday, prefigures subsequent developments in landscape painting.

This painting was previously owned by Max Stern (1904–1987) of the Galerie Stern, Düsseldorf, before he fled the Nazi regime in December 1937 and emigrated to Canada by way

of England. Before the National Gallery acquired the painting, the Swiss art dealer David Koetser (of David Koetser Gallery) and the Dr. & Mrs. Max Stern Foundation, Canada, the heir to Stern's estate, reached a friendly settlement resolving any and all of the foundation's claims to the painting. The National Gallery acquired the painting from Koetser through the generosity of The Lee and Juliet Folger Fund. The National Gallery is grateful for the careful provenance research conducted on this work by the Zentralinstitut für Kunstgeschichte, Munich.

### John Wilmerding Symposium on American Art and Community Celebration: Alma Thomas

The National Gallery's 2021 John Wilmerding Symposium on American Art and Community Celebration were featured as part of an expansive citywide celebration honoring the late pioneering artist on the 130th anniversary of her birth. Featuring a virtual introduction by former First Lady Michelle Obama, the John Wilmerding Symposium on American Art kicked off the festivities. Hosted virtually, the symposium brought together noted scholars, artists, and curators to discuss Alma Thomas's life and legacy through

virtual conversations. Following the symposium, the National Gallery of Art hosted an in-person, on-site community celebration honoring Thomas.

## Works from the Souls Grown Deep Foundation

The National Gallery of Art acquired 40 works from the Souls Grown Deep Foundation by 21 African American artists from the southern United States. The acquisition is made possible through the generosity of the Souls Grown Deep Foundation in addition to funds from the Patrons' Permanent Fund.

The acquisition includes nine quilts made by artists from Gee's Bend — a small African American community along the Alabama River where artists have created quilt masterpieces from recycled clothes and dresses, feed sacks, and fabric remnants for the last one hundred years. Mary Lee Bendolph (b. 1935), one of the best known and most revered quiltmakers, uses complex geometric and color structures in an ingenious elaboration on the traditional practice of quilting in strips and blocks. In a quilt she made in 2002, rectangles of brown wool and blue denim are juxtaposed with brightly colored strips and

squares that play off the structural framework of the "Housetop" pattern, a conventional design of concentric squares that is popular among the quiltmakers of Gee's Bend. According to Bendolph, her works draw inspiration from the colors, shapes, and patterns of the world around her, resulting in designs that are abstract remappings of the visual environment.

### **Podcast Series** *Sound Thoughts on Art*

The pandemic-related closure of the National Gallery of Art in 2020 caused the temporary suspension of the long-standing Sunday concert series. During this time, the museum launched the podcast series *Sound Thoughts on Art*, which explores the relationship between visual art and music. Hosted by musician and journalist Celeste Headlee, each episode features a conversation with a musician who has chosen a work of art from the National Gallery's collection and responded to it using sound. The first season features conversations with composer-pianist Vijay Iyer on I. M. Pei's East Building, hip-hop artist Jasiri X on Kerry James Marshall's woodcut *Untitled (Man)*, composer and instrumentalist

Bora Yoon on Nam June Paik's video sculpture *Ommah*, and many more. Headlee also talks with museum experts, who describe the works and provide art historical context. *Sound Thoughts on Art* tells the stories of how we experience art and how it connects us.

## **Christopher Wool**

The National Gallery acquired its first sculpture by Christopher Wool (b. 1955). *Untitled* (2017) is on view in the Sculpture Garden. The work's serpentine lines are a careful compositional choice that reflects Wool's recent gestural paintings.

For more than 30 years, Wool has pursued his career as a painter with focus and intensity, working almost entirely in black and white, reflecting the urban grit of his New York surroundings by using either large stenciled words or by exploring abstract lines, shapes, and patterns. Since 2007 Wool has been living parttime in Marfa, Texas, where he began to make sculptures inspired by tangles of old fencing and hay-baling wire that he finds on his property. He uses the wire to create small maquettes, some of which are then subjected to an elaborate process of 3D-scanning, computer-aided enlargement, and fabrication using metal alloys engineered for structural integrity.

### **Special Exhibitions** and Virtual Tours

Responding to the challenges of the moment, staff continued to make art more accessible to the public through digital programs and innovations. Virtual tours of special exhibitions *True to Nature: Open-Air Painting in Europe, 1780 – 1870, Degas at the Opéra, Raphael and His Circle,* and *Lynda Benglis* extended the reach of the institution both physically and temporally, allowing visitors across the world to explore the art from the comfort of their homes and continue enjoying the presentations in perpetuity.

### Conversations: Carrie Mae Weems and The Shaw 54th Regiment Memorial

Augustus Saint-Gaudens's *The Shaw 54th Regiment Memorial* and Carrie Mae Weems's *Untitled* speak to our nation's struggle to achieve racial equity and to the strength and sacrifice of those who have continued to wage the battle. The heroism of the 54th Massachusetts Regiment, one of the first African American regiments formed in the North during the Civil War, has inspired artists for more than 150 years. This fiscal year, the National Gallery of Art acquired Weems's seven-part series of inkjet prints — each a reproduction of a historic photograph and

each framed with sandblasted text on glass and installed it facing Saint-Gaudens's sculpture. Weems layers text and images to center African American perspectives, constructing a nuanced history that speaks of racial pride, resilience, sacrifice, and determination. In the late 19th century, Saint-Gaudens crafted his memorial honoring Colonel Robert Gould Shaw and the 54th Regiment, depicting their 1863 march through the streets of Boston on their way to war. The bronze version of the sculpture was installed on Boston Common in 1897. Saint-Gaudens continued to work on a plaster version of the memorial. now on view at the National Gallery. Hailed as one of the finest examples of 19th-century American sculpture, the memorial is celebrated for its sensitive rendition of the soldiers. One hundred years after the completion of the sculpture, Weems incorporated images of the memorial into her series of photographs, in a testament to its lasting power. Her work commemorates another march — that of African Americans streaming north from the Jim Crow South during the Great Migration — and celebrates the rich and vital history of African American culture.

# Treasurer's Report and Financial Statements

### **Treasurer's Report**

The National Gallery of Art's financial position improved significantly in fiscal year 2021 due to the favorable performance of the investment portfolio, combined with prudent management of expenses, strong support from Congress and the administration, and the continued generosity of private citizens, foundations, and corporations.

The federal commitment to operate and maintain the National Gallery originates in the 1937 Joint Resolution of Congress that accepted Andrew W. Mellon's unprecedented gift to the nation of his art collection, the funds to construct the West Building, and an endowment. The Joint Resolution pledged that the United States would provide funds for the upkeep, administrative expenses, and costs of operations, including the protection and care of the works of art given to the nation, so that the National Gallery would at all times be properly maintained and remain open to the public free of charge. The National Gallery receives annual federal appropriations to support core programs and renovations of its buildings as part of the budget approved annually by Congress and signed by the president. Income from endowments as well as gifts and grants designated by donors for other specific purposes supplement the federal appropriations. Endowment support for expenditures is computed under the National Gallery's spending policy and used in accordance with donorimposed restrictions. The National Gallery is a nonprofit organization exempt from federal income taxes under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code

#### **Financial Position**

The National Gallery's net assets totaled \$1.7 billion on September 30, 2021, increasing by \$288.2 million or 20.1 percent during the fiscal year. This result is mainly due to the performance of the investment portfolio, which ended the year at \$1.32 billion, up \$270.5 million net of new gifts, manager fees, and spending to support operations and art purchases. The portfolio returned 25.9 percent for the fiscal year, exceeding the National Gallery's custom investable benchmark by 410 basis points. Performance was positive across all asset classes, with US and emergingmarkets equities contributing the most powerfully to performance. The value of other investments and trusts held by others totaled \$36.6 million, increasing \$4.5 million over the prior year. Cash balances were modestly lower than the prior year.

Property, plant, and equipment assets increased \$26.5 million over the prior year, representing \$43.2 million of capital expenditures partly offset by \$16.7 million of depreciation expense. The majority of fiscal 2021 capital expenditures advanced progress on the renovation of the East Building atrium skylight and adjacent spaces. This project is included in the National Gallery's comprehensive Master Facilities Plan, a federally funded, long-term capital renewal program designed to address life safety, security, and infrastructure improvements necessary to maintain and protect the National Gallery's buildings. In addition to replacing the original atrium skylight, the project includes major building HVAC, electrical, and safety systems renovations; new fire egress stairs serving Tower 3; and replacement of the main entrance window wall. Work also continued on the installation of new gas-fired hot water boilers for all National Gallery heating and cooling. The new boilers will replace steam provided by a thirdparty utility service, increasing reliability and energy efficiency while reducing cost. The renovation of the East Building atrium skylight and adjacent spaces will be completed in fiscal year 2022, and the new boilers serving the East Building will be operational at that time. Planning and design continued for the West Building exterior stonework project, which is expected to begin in fiscal year 2022 in conjunction with the roof replacement.

Design work neared completion for the joint art storage project with the Smithsonian Institution at its museum support center in Suitland, Maryland, and a construction contract is expected to be awarded next fiscal year. Other capital expenditures include major modernization of elevators and design of fire, life safety, and network infrastructure associated with the security command center. In addition, a major renovation of the West Building Garden Café and related infrastructure was completed. Pledges receivable decreased \$14.8 million from the prior year. Pledge receipts from generous donors secured the successful completion of the Andrew W. Mellon 75th anniversary challenge grant in March 2021. The challenge grant resulted in over \$80 million in new endowments providing permanent support for education, research, conservation, digital media, exhibitions, and art acquisitions. Liabilities, including unexpended federal multiyear appropriations and environmental liabilities, totaled \$126.9 million, a reduction of \$3.6 million below the prior year.

#### **Operating Results**

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to severely disrupt or delay much of the National Gallery's on-site programs in fiscal 2021 with corresponding effects on operating revenue, support, and expenses. After partially reopening in June 2020, the National Gallery closed again to the public on November 21, 2020, in response to rising COVID-19 cases. The outdoor Sculpture Garden on the National Mall reopened to the public on February 14, 2021, with reduced capacity. After almost six months, the West Building partially reopened to the public on May 14, 2021, and the East Building reopened to visitors one month later on June 18, 2021.

In spite of the myriad pandemic-induced financial impacts, the National Gallery ended the fiscal year with an unrestricted operating surplus of \$0.6 million before depreciation and amortization. Operating support and revenue totaled \$168.5 million in fiscal year 2021, nearly level with fiscal year 2020. Federal support recognized for operations increased to \$139.8 million compared to \$136.6 million in the prior year. Operating gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, and foundations dropped to \$4.5 million compared to \$5.4 million in the prior year as a result of delayed special exhibitions and other postponed on-site programs. Sustained support from dedicated donors during the pandemic continued to play a critical role in making the National Gallery's outstanding exhibition, education, curatorial, and conservation programs possible. Funds appropriated for operations under the National Gallery's investment spending policy totaled \$22.3 million, nearly flat compared to \$21.9 million in fiscal year 2020. Royalties and other income also remained nearly level at \$0.7 million compared to \$0.6 million in the prior year.

Fiscal year 2021 operating expenses totaled \$167.9 million, decreasing \$1.8 million from the prior year. Expenses for special exhibitions, education, and other public programs decreased slightly due to the ongoing pandemic. Although on-site programs and attendance remained significantly below normal, the National Gallery's website and social media channels greatly expanded production and delivery of creative and engaging digital products and experiences, reaching larger and more diverse online audiences.

The National Gallery's collection was augmented by several major purchases in fiscal year 2021, including Jan Brueghel the Elder's *Wooded Landscape with Travelers*, 1610; Christopher Wool's *Untitled*, 2017; Thomas Schütte's *Man Without Face*, 2018; Alighiero Boetti's *Oggi diciannovesimo giorno ottavo mese dell'anno millenove100ottantotto (Today the Nineteenth Day of the Eighth Month of the Year OneThousand-Nine100Eighty-Eight)*, 1988; Carrie Mae Weems's *Untitled*, 1996, printed 2020; and four works from Melvin Edwards's Lynch Fragment series, with dates ranging from 1981 to 2005.

#### **Auditors' Report and Financial Statements**

The National Gallery's external auditors issued an unmodified opinion on the fiscal year 2021 financial statements and did not identify any material weaknesses, significant deficiencies, or areas of noncompliance with laws and regulations.





# National Gallery Loans to Temporary Exhibitions

The department of loans and the National Lending Service administered the loans of 335 works of art to 122 sites during fiscal year 2021. This year loans continued to be impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, affecting museums across the United States and internationally with exhibition postponements.
