WASHINGTON, APRIL 29: David E. Finley, Director, National Gallery of Art, announced that a meeting was held today at the National Gallery, with Mr. Finley presiding, to determine the wishes of the various museums in the United States regarding exhibition of the paintings from the Berlin museums and to arrange a schedule conforming to the expressed desires of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Department of the Army.
