NOTED AUTHORITY ON AMERICAN PAINTER
TO LECTURE IN WASHINGTON

On Sunday, June 1st, at 4 p.m., Professor Ransom R. Patrick, Chairman of the Art Department, Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, will give an illustrated lecture in the auditorium of the National Gallery of Art. His subject will be the life and work of the distinguished 19th-century portrait painter, John Neagle.

Professor Patrick has studied for many years the work of this Philadelphia artist, and much of the material for his lecture will now be presented to the public for the first time. A number of canvases by John Neagle are included in the selection of paintings from the National Gallery's collection which is currently on exhibition in the Central Gallery.

The lecture is open to the public without charge.
