SUNDAY EVENING CONCERTS RESUME AT THE NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART

WASHINGTON, September 10, 1962. John Walker, Director of the National Gallery of Art, announced today that the Gallery's 21st Music Season consisting of forty Sunday evening concerts will begin on September 23, 1962 and continue through June 23, 1963. It was also announced that these concerts will again be supported by a grant from the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation of Lisbon.

Mr. Walker said, "The forthcoming season will be the twentieth year that the concerts have been under the general direction of Richard Bales, who also conducts the National Gallery Orchestra. It will be the third successive year that the concerts have received the generous assistance of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation. Mr. Calouste Gulbenkian was a strong friend of the National Gallery of Art during his lifetime, and it is particularly gratifying to us that the Trustees of the Foundation have carried on his interest in the Gallery".

All concerts will be given in the East Garden Court of the National Gallery on Sunday evening at 8:00 o'clock, and are free to the public.

Through the cooperation of Local 161, American Federation of Musicians, the concerts will be broadcast in their entirety by Station WGMS-AM and FM, Washington.
