LEONARDO HORSE DRAWINGS FROM WINDSOR CASTLE TO PREMIERE AT NATIONAL GALLERY IN 1985

WASHINGTON, D. C. March 2, 1983. Leonardo da Vinci Horse Drawings from the Royal Library at Windsor Castle, an exhibition of 50 selected works of horse and animal drawings, premieres at the National Gallery of Art in the late winter of 1985 and will be on view for approximately three months. The announcement was made March 2, 1983, by the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco in conjunction with the visit of Queen Elizabeth II to the West Coast. The exhibition will be on view at the Art Institute of Chicago in the summer of 1985 and from November 1985 through February 1986 at the California Palace of the Legion of Honor.

The exhibition is being organized by The Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco in cooperation with the National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C., and the Art Institute of Chicago.
