# NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART'S FIFTY-SEVENTH CONCERT SEASON BEGINS OCTOBER 4, 1998

Washington, D.C. -- The National Gallery of Art will present thirty-eight concerts by a variety of renowned performers during its fifty-seventh season, October 4, 1998 - June 27, 1999. The National Gallery Orchestra, under the direction of music director George Manos, will present the first concert of the 1998-1999 season at the Gallery on Sunday, October 4. Maestro Manos and the Gallery orchestra will perform a total of nine concerts during the season. In addition to the orchestra, three other National Gallery resident ensembles will be heard: the National Gallery Vocal Arts Ensemble (January 24), the National Gallery Chamber Players String Quartet (June 20), and the National Gallery Chamber Players Wind Quintet (June 27).

#### AMERICAN MUSIC FESTIVAL

The Gallery's 1999 American Music Festival will include jazz, with the Brubeck Brothers Quartet appearing on May 16. The festival, scheduled in May, will also present the Gallery orchestra, pianist William Black, violinist Sally McLain, and the chamber choir, Musikanten, from Alexandria, Virginia.

#### INTERNATIONAL ARTISTS AND PREMIERES

International artists will include Brazilian pianist Joáo Carlos Martins (November 29), the Altenberg Trio of Vienna (February 21), Germany's Trio Parnassus (March 14), and the Lithuanian cello-piano duo of David and Tatjana Geringas (March 21). Four concerts will feature musicians from Canada: pianist Francine Kay (October 18), the Alcan String Quartet (October 25), baritone Brett Polegato (January 3), and cellist Shauna Rolston with pianist Bernadene Blaha (April 18). Several premiere performances are in store for concert audiences, including the Washington premiere of *Quartet No. 3* by Nicholas Maw, a British-born composer who is now a Washington resident.

#### **HOLIDAY CONCERTS**

The traditional holiday concerts are planned for December 20, when the guest ensemble will be the Washington Men's Camerata, and January 10, when the National Gallery Orchestra will play its Gala Viennese New Year Concert.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

Admission to Gallery concerts is free and the audience is admitted on a first-come, first-served basis, starting at 6:00 p.m. each Sunday. The Sixth Street and Constitution Avenue entrance to the West Building remains open for concert-goers, and the Garden Café is open until 6:30 p.m. Performances begin at 7:00 p.m. and end at approximately 8:30 p.m. Concertgoers who arrive after 7:00 p.m. will be

asked to wait in the outer lobby until intermission. Monthly listings of the concert programs can be found on the Gallery's Web site at www.nga.gov. Concerts are open to the public and will continue every Sunday through June 27, with the exception of April 4, Easter Sunday. A complete schedule follows.
