Discover the Holiday Season at the National Gallery of Art with Caroling, Gallery Talks, Ice-Skating, Curated Gifts, Seasonal Flavors, and Festive Decorations



Stunning floral displays in the West Building Rotunda rotate throughout the winter and into spring and make the Gallery a classic holiday destination.

Washington, DC—The National Gallery of Art celebrates the holiday season throughout the month of December with a variety of free programs, including concerts, caroling, films, lectures, and gallery talks. All programs are free and open to the public on a first-come, first-served basis. The National Gallery of Art Sculpture Garden ice rink offers skaters of all ages an opportunity to enjoy winter weather amid stunning large-scale sculpture. The Gallery and Sculpture Garden will be closed on December 25 and January 1.

### **Holiday Decorations**

Beginning Monday, December 2, eight Christmas trees adorned with sparkling white lights, hundreds of poinsettias of varying colors, white hydrangeas, and amaryllis will grace the Rotunda and East and West Garden Courts, creating a festive, holiday atmosphere on the Main Floor of the West Building.

The holiday display in the Rotunda is made possible by a generous endowment established in 2003 by Lee and Juliet Folger. Additional red and white poinsettias inside tree wells will greet visitors as they enter the East Building Atrium.

## Lecture

"The Christmas Story in Art" is a 60-minute lecture about paintings in the permanent collection that depict the birth of Jesus. It is given by Gallery lecturer David Gariff in the West Building Lecture Hall. A slideshow of many of the featured works is available online.

# **Caroling at the Gallery**

The Gallery's long-standing tradition of community caroling in the West Building Rotunda is a favorite family activity during the holidays. Groups perform their own music as well as lead the audience in familiar Christmas carols. Performances last 45 minutes; singers and spectators of all ages are welcome. ## **Holiday Performances**

In addition to caroling, two performances in the West Garden Court, West Building will celebrate the holiday season. On December 15 at 3:30 p.m., Calmus Vocal Ensemble performs an international selection of Christmas carols from Denmark, Germany, England, France, Ireland, Croatia, Peru, Portugal, Puerto Rico, Russia, Sweden, and Spain. On December 21 at 3:30 p.m., the East of the River ensemble merges music of the Mediterranean, Balkans, Armenia, and the Middle East in an unforgettable musical journey for the New Year titled *Solstice: Darkness Is Your Candle*.

## **Sculpture Garden Ice Rink**

The 2019–2020 ice-skating season at the Sculpture Garden Ice Rink begins on November 15, 2019, and continues through March 15, 2020, weather permitting. Skating classes are offered for all ages and abilities. Located on the National Mall between 7th and 9th Streets along Constitution Avenue NW, the ice rink continues to be a favorite winter destination, attracting thousands of visitors each year.

Skating in the Sculpture Garden, surrounded by the grand architecture of national museums and monuments and in close proximity to the Capitol, is enhanced by views of post–World War II

sculptures from the Gallery's collection by artists such as Louise Bourgeois, Alexander Calder, Roy Lichtenstein, and Roxy Paine. The ice rink is managed by Guest Services, Incorporated.

At the Espresso & Gelato Bar in the East Building, special seasonal flavors of gelato may be purchased throughout the month of December. They are located on the National Mall between 3rd and 9th Streets at Constitution Avenue NW, and are open Monday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The Gallery is closed on December 25 and January 1. Visitors will be asked to present all carried items for inspection upon entering. Checkrooms are free of charge and located at each entrance. Luggage and other oversized bags must be presented at the 4th Street entrances to the East or West Building to permit x-ray screening and must be deposited in the checkrooms at those entrances. For the safety of visitors and the works of art, nothing may be carried into the Gallery on a visitor's back. Any bag or other items that cannot be carried reasonably and safely in some other manner must be left in the checkrooms. Items larger than 17 by 26 inches cannot be accepted by the Gallery or its checkrooms.
