

Pianist MARJORIE LEE attended Western Michigan University and the University of Maryland, where her principal teachers were Roy Hamlin Johnson and Irwin Freundlich. In addition to being a finalist and prize winner in the latter university's International Piano Competition, Ms. Lee has won Frist Prize in the Matthay Association Piano Competition and the International Recording Competition. In 1986, she was selected to represent the United States in the USIA's Artistic Ambassadors program, which took her on a concert tour of Western Europe.

Ms. Lee is an active concert artist and an Associate Professor of Piano at George Mason University, in Fairfax, Virginia.
