

LAWRENCE SCHUBERT has received outstanding critical acclaim for his four major New York recitals at Town Hall and Carnegie Hall. The New York Times has praised Mr. Schubert as "a superior pianistic talent" and "a patrician musical intellect". He has performed in various parts of the United States for colleges, libraries, museums, recital series and radio broadcasts, as well as presenting lecture-recitals and master classes. His concerto appearances have included engagements with the South Carolina Philharmonic and the Orquesta Sinfonica de Maracaibo, in Venezuela. Mr. Schubert has been heard as recitalist in London at the Purcell Room and at Wigmore Hall.

In addition to an extensive repertoire of standard literature of all periods, Lawrence Schubert enjoys presenting rarely heard works of Ernő Dohnányi, Nikolay Metner and Paul Hindemith. He is a member of the faculty at Molloy College in Rockville Center, New York.

Mr. Schubert appears by arrangement with Raymond Weiss Artist Management, Inc. of New York City.
